### **Life-Giving Interactions**

*"I came so they can have real and eternal life, more and better life than they ever dreamed of."*

Jesus words in John 10:10b, The Message

The Sermon Series this summer is, **Life-Giving Prayer**.

God desires that our interactions with Him and one another would be life-giving. Jesus came full of grace and truth (John 1:14) so that we could discover life to the fullest. This summer we will be looking at various scriptures and ways of praying that can strengthen our communication with God. Ways that help us both receive and share God's grace and truth in life-giving ways.



We receive grace and truth best when there are relationships where we feel:

**Seen** – They know us. They have taken time to learn about our history, hopes, and fears (Psalm 139:1-4).

**Soothed** – They express empathy. They understand and connect with us around what we are feeling and thinking (Hebrews 4:15-16).

**Secure** – They unconditionally love us. Their commitment to us does not change based on circumstances or our behavior (Joshua 1:5 and Romans 5:8).

**Safe** – They support us. We can be open, honest, and vulnerable and not be judged but helped (John 3:17).

When these characteristics are present in a relationship, it creates a space in which grace and truth can be received and people thrive. If these don't exist in a relationship, people will be guarded or distant and there is a lesser degree to which they will receive grace and truth.

My prayer is that this would be a life-giving summer for you and the people around you! That we all would feel increasingly seen, soothed, secure, and safe in our relationship with God. And because of this we would increasingly be receiving and sharing God's grace and truth in life-giving ways.

May we know more of the good life with our good God,



### Why Are We Involved in 2 VBS Events This Summer?

1. Affordable summer childcare is difficult to find for many families in our community. Vacation Bible Schools help ease the financial and mental loads for families, and allow us to build better relationships with our community. There are fewer churches offering VBS programs this year, leaving gaps in the summer calendar that we are helping to fill.
2. As Presbyterians, ecumenical (interdenominational) relationships are fundamental to our understanding of Christian faith and mission. The body of Christ needs all its parts to function, and by partnering with churches from other denominations, we are uniting the body of Christ toward love and service to our community.


Youth Group is jumping into our Summer schedule starting in June!

During May, the Church received \$35,157 in total operating income and had expenses totaling \$47,213 resulting in a net loss of \$12,056 from operations, compared to an expected net loss of \$7,639.

Offerings in May were below budget by \$3,190 and the year-to-date offerings are now under budget by \$4,845. Most Expenses were close to target again in May.

We continue to celebrate that the church is debt free.

## Session Corner:

June, 2025

### Strategic Planning Updates:

- Facilities (Curt): Session approved a motion to accept the quote from MacDonald Miller spending up to \$175,000 on HVAC repair/replacement and authorizing Buildings and Grounds to get bids on plumbing replacement/repair in the Ed Wing.
- Youth and Family (Dede and Marlie): Session approved proposed program changes to Sunday Morning Children's worship, which adapts Godly Play to an updated K-5 program to be called **Wonder-Full Worship** that will start in August.

### Pastor's Report:

- History and Hope Gatherings will be held July 17 from 5-7 pm and August 10 from 12-2. The congregation is invited to participate.
- New Members classes are scheduled for June 22 and 29 following the church service.
- Session approved a motion by Pastor Tom to do the demographic study up to a 20-mile radius of the church and spend up to \$500.

### Staff Updates:

- Session approved the updated Music Ministry Job Description with a motion by Marlie. A search team is being formed that will begin looking in July for our next Director of Music Ministry.
- Session approved the Pastoral Associate Job Description and Terms of Employment beginning June 1, 2025 for Dr. Elizabeth Klein with a motion by Pastor Tom.
- Pastor Tom will be working with the Youth and Family MT in the Fall to begin a search for the next Youth Pastor who would start next summer (2026).

### NW Coast Presbytery - delegates report

Carlene participated in the clerk training offered.

### Marlie shared about the two Book of Order amendments that were voted on by the Presbytery:

- The first amendment that was voted on passed.

Specific Language: In Christ, by the power of the Spirit, God unites persons through baptism regardless of race, ethnicity, age, sex, gender identity, sexual orientation, disability, geography, or theological conviction. There is therefore no place in the life of the Church for discrimination against any person. The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) shall guarantee full participation and representation in its worship, governance, and emerging life to all persons or groups within its membership

- The second amendment failed to pass at our Presbytery but passed nationally.

Specific Language: The council responsible for ordination and/or installation (G-2.0402; G-2.0607; G-3.0306) shall examine each candidate's calling, gifts, preparation, and suitability for the responsibilities of ordered ministry. The examination shall include, but not be limited to, a determination of the candidate's ability and commitment to fulfill all requirements as expressed in the constitutional questions for ordination and installation (W-4.0404), the Historic Principles of Church Order (F-3.01), and in the principles of participation and representation found in F-1.0403. Councils shall be guided by Scripture and the confessions in applying standards to individual candidates
