



CHANGING NATIONS THROUGH SERVANT LEADERSHIP

Rev. Kathy Giske is an Australian-Greek born in Cairo, Egypt. Living in an international community with its many cultures and languages prepared Kathy for her life's work. She began her career serving in trade relations with the Australian Embassy in Athens, Greece. Her work involved travel to the Middle East where she witnessed first-hand the spiritual hunger and physical needs of the people. Motivated by God's compassionate heart, Kathy began to sense God calling her to serve as an international mission strategist.

In the years that followed, the Billy Graham team recruited Kathy to serve as program director for three world congresses that gave her opportunity to meet and build relationships with hundreds of leaders from every continent. She has also served in leadership positions with World Vision International, Issachar, and thirteen years with Frontier Fellowship. Through her growing networks, Kathy connected resources to opportunities by forming partnerships that empowered indigenous leaders to be a force for good in their community.

Today, in her role as Director of Middle East Partners, Kathy is able to converge a lifetime of leadership experience and passion to this strategic vision. Although Kathy has no children of her own, she has a passion to mentor the next generation of younger leaders to achieve preeminence in their sphere of influence and fulfill their calling. She regularly takes them own mission trips to the Middle East so they can connect and serve with organizations serving refugees from that region.

For thirty years, Kathy was married to her best friend and husband, Steven Eric Giske, whom she lost to brain cancer in January 2025. She is an active member at University Presbyterian Church where she serves as a pastoral assistant.

Bible 101


Bible 101

During March, the Church received \$49,896 in total operating income and had total expenses of \$59,655, resulting in a net loss of \$9,760 from operations, compared to an expected net loss of \$9,198. The final \$96,522 payment for the Electrical Panel Project was completed in March. The Statement of Activities compares the actual total income and expenses to the Annual Budget. The Assets Statement lists the Church's total cash and investments. The General Operating Account covers the monthly routine bills and salaries, while Investments are long-term in nature. 


It's not done yet, but something new is coming to the Youth Room...stay tuned!

As part of the Snohomish Pride Community Agreements, they have placed 'Edges to Center' at the heart of their work. This is one example of what the 'Edges to Center' work focuses on.

EDGES TO CENTER

- Intersecting identities of race, disability, neurodivergence, mental health, income level, size, age, immigration status, Indigenous heritage, etc. affect our lived experiences and perceptions.
- The more intersecting marginalized identities one has, the less access there is to privilege in this world; the more privilege one has, the more access to unearned advantages one has.
- Make space and listen to the most marginalized among us. If we center spaces around the most marginalized, it's safe for all, but when we center the most privileged, it's safe for only a few. If you have many privileged identities, reflect on some of the unearned advantages that may unconsciously shape how you approach this work.

Be curious about how you might approach others differently with this in mind and listen well to those around you who may have a more expansive view to offer.

SESSION CORNER: April 2025

Moderator - Pastor Tom Dabasinskas

- Encouragement was given to participate in the Pride Parade on June 7th as part of **THE PROGRESSIVE CHURCHES** (Christ the King, FPCS, Snohomish United Methodist, St. John, Cedar Cross, Everett United Church of Christ, Kirkland Congregational-UCC, Lake Washington Christian Church and United in Grace ELSA/UMC).
- Approval was given with delight for the new **Family Ministry Team** members: Kay Ditzenberger, Kelly Snow, Shellie Starr, Shelagh Hizzey, and Joyce Chambers to support the work that Talea is doing.

Strategic Planning Updates

Communications - Carol Mastrofini: Carol, Carole Van Loo, Carlene Crossman make up this group. They've been meeting with small groups of 2 or 3, and have met with 7 groups so far which make up a sampling of the membership. They focused on internal communication using 3 questions, what's working well in our church communication, where we can improve, and ideas to help us communicate in new and meaningful ways. Next, they will focus on external communication by having non-attenders & non-members watch a sermon online and fill out a survey describing their experience. It was decided the May 18th sermon would work for this.

Building/Facilities – Curt Green: Curt shared how the group has met all through December and created an outline of work that needs to be done. Currently they're problem solving the HVAC for the sanctuary. Michael Prihoda, co-chair of Sanctuary Refresh is on the team. The team is working with some of Refresh ideas as they work to get the must-do items done first. Pastor Tom noted that we'd prefer to have an overall plan, and have that plan broken into smaller chunks. Curt shared that immediate problems need to be addressed first such as the HVAC work, but also try to do some Refresh work along the way. Pastor Tom attended the last meeting and will continue to work to help facilitate progress/process with all stakeholders.

Youth and Family – Dede Babcock: Dede shared the information from their last meeting. They have formed a Youth and Family ministry team. They meet with Talea every other week. They are working on getting adult volunteers to be with Talea at each youth group. Godly Play teachers are taking July and August off, there are about 6 teachers currently. Discussed challenges of having a large group of various aged students all on one night.

2025 Nominating Committee – Mary Beth has agreed to be the elder moderator. Members at large are Marita Bishop, Carlene Crossman, and Linda Mueller. Deacons Rep TBD. The work will be increased this year with the nomination of the Pastor Nominating Committee.
