### Pastor's Corner

Let's hold firmly to the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful; and let's consider how to encourage one another in love and good deeds.

Hebrews 10:24-25

Thank-you for your warm, gracious welcome of Tori and me. We have been blessed by how you are living out FPCS's Mission Statement: growing deeper in faith and reaching wider in love.



Lent provides a great time to encourage one another in these directions. The Oxford Dictionary defines encouragement as, "giving support, confidence or hope to someone." As followers of Jesus, we have a certain hope because of God dwelling with and in us (Colossians 1:27 and Romans 5:5). This is a hope worth knowing and sharing! Our Lent series is entitled, **The Hope of Glory**. This will be a great time to hear more about this encouraging hope.

My prayer is that you would not just hear about but personally grow in knowing and sharing the hope of Christ. To do this, we all need people with whom we can discuss and apply what we are learning from the scriptures. Do you have relationships where you can do that? A great place to build these types of relationships is ConneXtion Group. These are small groups that will be gathering once again during Lent. The article in this newsletter written by the Spiritual Formation Ministry Team will give you more details on how you can be part of a ConneXtion Group.

Whether it be in a ConneXtion group or with other supportive friends, I encourage you to make the most of these supportive relationships by doing three things:

- Share your story authentically – Honestly share with one another. Where have you seen God at work and where do you want to see God at work? What are the faith steps God has helped you take and what are the faith steps ahead of you?
- Be compassionately curious – Ask questions that will help you get to know people. Then listen with a prayerful attentiveness as to what God is doing in their life and yours.
- Love the "strangers" in your life - These might be people estranged due to conflict or differences. Or this might be someone different than us that we haven't taken the time to get to know.

These three things will take courage to do. What better place to practice this than with supportive friends who can encourage us. I know that as we relate in these ways, we will see God moving in our lives in beautiful ways. "He who promised is faithful." I look forward to hearing those stories!




LENT begins with the Ash Wednesday service on March 5 at 7:00, and continues for 40 days (not counting Sundays), reflecting Jesus' 40 day fast in the desert prior to beginning his ministry. The Spirituality Formation Team is providing resources for this meaningful time leading up to our observances of Holy Week.

- All the congregation is encouraged to take a copy of the devotional book "Rise" by John Pavlovitz, a companion book to the one we used in Advent called "Low." These are available in the narthex.
- We will also be offering more 6-week ConnectXion groups on a variety of days & times, for a small group sharing experience during Lent. These are in addition to the ongoing groups, which folks may also join for the 6 weeks or longer. Look for the sign-up lists in the narthex.
- Small groups are a good way to share our spiritual life, reflections & struggles. We also get to know other people in our congregation at a deeper level.
- The study of "UnClobber" also continues through Lent at 9am Sundays. This book is a deep & serious look at the 6 passages in our Bible which are often quoted against people who are LGBTQ.




There are six passages in scripture, the “clobber” passages, that have often been used by mainline churches to exclude men and women in the LGBTQ+ community. The book **UnClobber** by Colby Martin reexamines each of those six passages to see what the Bible says and doesn’t say about homosexuality. UnClobber will be the basis for a ten-week adult education class beginning Sunday, February 2. Together we will study the Biblical teachings and interpretations in Martin’s book as well as share our own stories and questions around this critical and divisive issue.

Some of the questions we will be addressing include:

- Who and how does God call us to love?
- What do we do when our hearts and our heads don’t seem to align with what we read in scripture?
- What is at stake when we exclude marginalized communities?

We invite you to join us at **9:00 Sunday** mornings. We meet in the **Community Room**. Dave Pugh leads us in this important study and discussion. A limited number of books are available in the Narthex or you can order a copy on Amazon.



RISE is a 40-day journey of elevated hopes and ascending spirits with short reflections for each day of Lent, which begins on Wednesday, March 5th. It speaks to the way we are called and invited to get back up:

- We allow our hopes to rise when we are in the middle of the struggle.
- We wait in darkness for the sun to rise, knowing that joy comes in the morning.
- We rise to our feet after falling to our knees in desperate prayer.


- We rise when we are knocked from our feet, persistent in this life.
- We rise to meet the coming day, knowing we are held by a Love that will have the last word.

We hope RISE will be the perfect companion for the season and that you’ll join us as we seek higher places and better angels.

While she is with us, Talea will fully participate in the life of the congregation. This includes participating in worship, fellowship, learning, mission, and sharing of gifts, building a network of relationships, and demonstrating Christian discipleship. Additionally, she will:

- Develop relationships with youth and families who attend FPCS and in the larger community.
- Work in coordination with the rest of the church staff.
- Plan and host regular age-appropriate Bible based meetings.
- Plan and organize regular monthly combined youth and children's ministry events.
- Partner with other churches in the community on ecumenical events.
- Deliver the children's message in worship at least once a month.
- Maintain compliance with "Safe in our Care."
- Planning youth and children's participation in special worship events, which may include:
  - Youth Sunday
  - Family Christmas Eve Service

The Arab Baptist Theological Seminary, located in Lebanon, equips leaders for ministry challenges in the Middle East and North Africa using on-line classes. We currently have 2 missionaries who are professors for the seminary - Grace Al-Zoughbi and Dustin Ellington. Grace is currently teaching a course on missiology - offering a Middle Eastern perspective that equips them for mission work in the region. The course emphasizes contextual theology, helping students share the gospel in a culturally relevant way. Dustin teaches classes on the Old Testament.

### **Michael and Grace al Zoughbi Arteen**



In the past month Grace & Michael organized a forum for the theological schools in the Middle East to explore ways to share the gospel effectively in the workplace. Michael has been working on projects supporting displaced Syrians and Lebanese as well as Palestinian Christians providing practical help and hope to those affected by war. He is preparing for meetings with Christians from Morocco, Mauritania, Sudan and Algeria. His focus is on exploring ways to support these communities, many of whom face significant challenges in their faith journey. His goal is to offer both spiritual and tangible assistance to strengthen the local church in North Africa.

Together they remain committed to encouraging theological education, discipleship and collaboration within the broader Christian community , ensuring that the church in the Middle East and North Africa is equipped to face current challenges and future opportunities.

### **Dustin and Sherri Ellington**

Dustin and Sherri were based in Lebanon but because of the war and instability there they are now in Jordan. Sherri does theological editing for the ABTS seminary's blog and seeks to be relationally involved with them. She feels called to spend time in prayer for his work in the Middle East, including for holistic peace. She is currently working on a Master of Arts in Ministry at a Presbyterian seminary in Dubuque Iowa. Dustin along with his classes at ABTS continues to study eshmen Arabic since he teaches and preaches in Arabic and now live and work in a different area with different dialects.


