

During June, the Church received \$33,977 in total operating income and had total expenses of \$51,538 resulting in a net loss of \$17,562 from operations, compared to an expected net loss of \$4,810.

Offerings in June were below budget by \$14,712 and the year-to-date offerings are now under budget by \$20,057. Most expenses were close to target again in June.

We continue to celebrate that the church is debt-free.

While we plan to continue incorporating elements of the Godly Play curriculum next year—given our investment in it—we aim to expand to a three-year cycle introducing children to foundational Bible teachings. In addition to our annual Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter lessons, we will cover themes such as:

- **Patriarchs**
- **Women in the Bible**
- **Children in the Bible**
- **Kings of Israel**
- **Prophets**
- **Traditional stories from Godly Play (Creation, Moses at Mt. Sinai, Noah, etc.)**

SESSION CORNER

August 2025

FINANCIAL REPORT: Pledging is behind what is considered normal for summer giving. If an adjustment needs to be made in any pledge, it is good to let the treasurer (Vicki Hesseltine) know. Vicki will reach out to the small number of people using the old online giving system, helping transition to the new one.

FALL CHURCH RETREAT: Session approved a request to serve communion at the retreat by Elizabeth Klein and Becky Kiser. Session approved a motion to use fundraising monies to include both scholarships and retreat-related expenses that can be carried over from year to year in an equity account.

2025 VISION AND BUDGET:

A mission study team/planning group will be forming soon to begin this work of a vision for the future that comes from the leadership and congregation. The PNC expenses related to the search and moving of an incoming pastor will be part of this budget also.

STRATEGIC PLANNING UPDATES:

- FACILITIES - The HVAC repairs are needing adjustments but proceeding.
- SANCTUARY REFRESH - The enthusiastic team is proceeding with getting bids for work and contractors for the work. A capital campaign is being discussed with the Stewardship Committee. Preparing our sanctuary for the 150th Anniversary in the Spring is exciting!
- COMMUNICATIONS: Carol shared survey results from the online worship experience feedback from non-members. Ten out of 12 people completed the survey. Respondents identified areas they thought we were doing well and areas that need improvement. A standout was how important as a tool is our website where people first look for a church! Next steps are planned for AV and Worship, and training.
- YOUTH AND FAMILY - A strong leadership team has been formed.

A Youth Director job description is being formed and a search team will begin in September.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

- Session approved a Director of Music Ministry Search Team: Anna Thelen, Heather Shropshire, Phil Prins, Jason Gamble, Chris Harkness, and Curt Jonson, with Elizabeth Klein providing pastoral guidance.
- Session approved spending up to \$2,000 for A/V training and support. Some of the money will come from the savings of not having a Music Director this summer.
- Session approved a motion by Pastor Tom to receive the following new members into the life of the congregation: Tom and Kay Staggs, Laney Newton, Rita Hardin, Steve and Pam Willis, Richard and Nancy Walker.
